

Respect Safety Personal Best

Term 4 Week 2 - Our focus for the coming week's PBL lesson:

Learning Intention: To help students understand that "Right Place Right Time and doing the right thing" is an important aspect of school life for their safety and personal best.

Why is it important?

So that students embrace school expectations as a means for them to practise 'doing the right thing' and understand that rules are everywhere in life to ensure we are safe, respectful citizens.

Specific skills to be taught:

School Rules for each value – see posters in each classroom

Safety 2.Respect 3.Personal Best

Success Criteria:

Moving around the school in a quiet orderly manner.

Everyone is in the right place at the right time.

Calm voices.

Follow teacher's directions.

Be responsible for yourself and respectful to others.

Return to class promptly after going on a message or to the toilets.

We remind ourselves and each other to always meet our three core values of safety, respect and personal best every day. If we do the right things, we may get rewarded with Class Dojo's or Hadley awards.

Intention to apply for Year 7 entry to a selective high school in 2021 Dear Parent/Carer Selective high schools cater for academically high potential and gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates of their own academic standard. Selective schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, using specialised teaching methods and materials. Selective high schools are unzoned so parents can apply regardless of where they live. Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 12 March 2020. If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2021, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from late-September 2019 at https:// education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7. The application website opens at that link on 8 October 2019 and closes at 10pm on 11 November 2019. You must apply before the closing date. There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance after You must submit only ONE application for each student Remember: the tear-off slip below is NOT an application and the school cannot apply on your behalf. Introducing FPS Staff:

Hi. I'm Mrs Phillip and my class this year are the Cheetahs in 1/20.

For as long as I can remember I always wanted to become a teacher. As a young girl I would line my teddies and dolls up on a picnic blanket and read to them. One day my father brought home an old wooden school desk that was going to be replaced with a modern one. I was very excited about this as it meant I could teach my little sister. She was not so enthusiastic about playing schools as I think I was always the teacher.

I ventured out west to Bourke Public School for my last teaching experience at college. Growing up on the coast I had never travelled further west than Armidale so the vast, flat land and remoteness were fascinating to me. I began working at the Bourke School of Distance Education the following year. I loved the experience of teaching children on remote sheep stations and those that lived around the Mudgee area, too far from a school. Some were lucky enough to have a governess but mostly they were taught by their mothers.

I applied for a position at The Dubbo School of Distance Education and once again was teaching children in remote areas and expat children in Papua New Guinea. I learned to teach over the 'radio' in a similar way to The School of the Air. I travelled to places like Brewarrina, Walgett and Louth to visit my students and participate in workshops. This was a wonderful experience for a young teacher from the coast.

I met my husband, Jonathan, during my fifteen years in Dubbo. I was then teaching at Orana Heights Public School. Our favourite weekend activity was to visit the Dubbo Zoo with our two little boys, Nicholas and Lachlan. We loved our life out west but were drawn to the coastal life style and family in this area.

We welcomed Sophie to our family and our household is a typically busy one here in Forster. We have been involved in Little Athletics, gymnastics, dance, soccer and endless swimming and squad lessons at the YMCA.

I sometimes pause and think how amazing it is to be teaching in a school over the road from the beach! I read about crowded city schools and think how lucky we are. It is also special to be teaching at Forster Public School as my father was the principal here before it became a primary school.

One of my favourite moments in teaching is to read beautiful picture story books to the class. A good story is a wonderful shared experience and it can take your imagination anywhere.

Operation Christmas Child

During Term 3 the children in classes 4/5-11 and 5/1 had the opportunity to support 'Operation Christmas Child'. This is the world's largest **Christmas** project of its kind where gift-filled shoeboxes are delivered to children in need around the world.

We watched videos in class showing the process involved in filling a box and what happens when it reaches its destination. Then through much discussion each class decided on whether to buy for a boy or a girl and the age group. After that it was up to the children to bring in gifts, keeping in mind that many of these children have suffered significant trauma and therefore the gifts had to be appropriate.

Each class filled 2 boxes and an extra one was completed with left over gifts. The five boxes were packed up, labelled and then delivered to a local person who took them to Sydney for postage to the selected country. The journey of the boxes has begun.
