


## Transition from

Year 2 to Year 3

On Wednesday 1st December, our Year 2 students will spend the morning in a Year 3 classroom and the current Year 3 teachers will discuss with them the similarities and differences about being in the primary. Year 2 students will be taken on a tour of all the areas used by Year 3 students at our school and have their questions answered about what it's like being a Year 3 student at FPS.



#### FROM THE KITCHEN GARDEN ...

This fortnight the children have been treated with homemade scones, jam & sparkling Juice.

They had a tour of the garden & were shown the produce we used when making the treats for the week.

We use all our senses to help recognise the herbs, touch, smell, sight & taste. Learning what herbs & flowers are ok to eat is an important lesson. We used the flowers from herbs to decorate the ice in our sparkling juice.

The 3 ingredient scones were a hit with the rhubarb & strawberry jam, a new taste sensation for some.

The scone recipe is very simple and easy to make at home with the children, with just self-raising flour, milk & lemonade, or coconut cream for dairy free. Recipe attached to newsletter.

For those who think their children would love to try our homemade jam, the canteen will be using our own homemade jam that is made without any of the additives you see on the shop brought ones.

#### You can buy either Scones \$1 or Pancakes 50c served with our jam.

#### SCONE RECIPE

Preheat oven to 220 deg Sift 3 1/2 cups of self raising flour into a bowl with a Pinch of salt Then pour 1 cup of lemonade 1/2 cup of milk or cream Lightly mix together, dont over do it, less handling with the dough the fluffier they'll be. Tip dough out onto floured bench And roll dough out to about 2 cm thick. Using a small round glass lightly dusted in flour cut out circles of dough. Place cut out dough on a lined baking tray and brush each one with milk. Bake for 15 mins. Once cooked, cool slightly before adding jam and cream if you like to have yourself a treat.


#### From the Library...
