As part of our workshop activities, we recently watched a catch-up recording of a NSW Education livestream with celebrity author Yvette Poshoglian, who has written many great titles you might know, including the 'Ella and Olivia' series. We learnt some great ideas, including:

* Look around you, develop your imaginary characters from people who you know and meet - maybe even a favourite pet!

* Write about things that you love, your own interests and try to write every day.

* Think about a skill or hobby that you are good at and centre a story about that topic.

* Become a people and animal watcher! Watch what is happening in the world around you and use them to inspire a great story.

* Think about the genre e.g. Is it going to be a mystery, adventure, comedy or perhaps a story about a quest or a hero's journey?

* JUST WRITE! The first sentence is often the hardest...... Keep going!
