PRINCIPALS REPORT - Mr Peter Johnson

Dear Parents/Carers,

We are well and truly into Term 2 now and have been as busy as ever over the last few weeks. Students in Yrs 3 and 5 sat the NAPLAN tests and our leaders recently enjoyed a day at Club Forster with GRIP Leadership talking about what an effective leader is at school and how they can position themselves to be the best leader they can.

Each year, like all NSW public schools, we can request contributions to enhance our educational and sporting programs. School contributions help provide additional educational resources for the benefit of students. Payment is voluntary. An agreement has been reached with the P&C about the level of the Voluntary Contribution being asked this year to help support programs run here at Forster Public School. The fees are \$35 per child or \$50 per family and go a long way to contributing to helping programs benefiting all students here at the school.

As the weather is getting colder, we are seeing more and more students coming to school each day in clothing that is not part of our school uniform. School uniforms promote a sense of belonging and unity and ensure each child is comfortable and safe for all the activities they do each day at school. The overwhelming majority of our students are coming dressed in full school uniform each day and it is fantastic to see. 






Forster Public School will be taking part in the Do It For Dolly Fundraising Day on
