### PRINCIPALS REPORT Mr Peter Johnson

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to school for Term 2. The weather certainly has cooled off and we are looking forward to another busy term. This week sees students in Yr 3 and Yr 5 sitting the NAPLAN tests in Reading, Language Conventions, Writing and Numeracy. These tests give us great insight into our Yr3 and Yr5 cohorts as well as trend data for us to drive our school improvement. Most of the tests are being conducted online (Yr3 Writing is still on paper) meaning we should see our results earlier than in previous years.

Also driving our continuous improvement strategies are our attendance programs. We continually look at the attendance data of our students to see any issues arising due to non-attendance. Our aim is for all students to be present at school for at least 95% of the time that the school is open. Ensuring each student attends school for at least 95% is setting them up for the best chance of achieving academic success.

### Late Arrivals

Sometimes students can arrive late for school for any number of reasons. Usually due to an unavoidable appointment that could not be made outside school hours. It is critical that if your child is late for school that a parent or carer come into the office to drop them off, sign them in and explain the reason for their lateness. Students who arrive late without a parent or carer are marked as absent for that time as 'absent – unexplained'. The reason for it being unexplained is that we are only able to accept reasons for absence from an adult who is responsible for that child. We also need parents or carers to accompany their child into school as a child protection issue. For the safety of all our students, accompanying them into school when they are late ensures they arrive safely at school.

### The Importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

### Justifiable absences from school

Our school, following Department of Education guidelines, recognises that there are times when students need to be absent from school. Justifiable absences include - being sick or having an infectious disease, having an unavoidable medical appointment, being required to attend a recognised religious holiday or exceptional / urgent family circumstances (e.g. attending a funeral) In these cases, absences are marked as 'explained - justified' on the roll and contribute to your child's attendance rate. Absences for other reasons may be marked on the roll as 'explained - unjustified' as they fall outside the criteria for a justified absence also contributing to your child's attendance rate.

Normally our school notifies parents of a student absence via text message around 11am each morning. A response to this text message is considered the same as if a note had been sent to the class teacher explaining the absence. Absences of two or more days are usually followed up by the class teacher if we have not heard from you and can also serve as an explanation for the absences.

If your child has COVID related absences from school, a copy of the text message or email received from NSW Health is enough evidence to explain the absences.

Also remember that a good old-fashioned letter from the parent / carer to the classroom teacher upon the student's return to school explaining the absence is also fine.

Absences of three or more days need to be supported by a medical certificate.

### Travel

At times, families may also decide that they wish to take their child(ren) on a holiday during school times. Travel is encouraged outside school times, however when this cannot be avoided an 'Application for Extended Leave' form must be filled in for the principal to review and consider approval. Absences due to travel, and after the extended leave form is filled in. are marked as 'absent - leave approved by the principal' on the roll and contribute to your child's attendance rate. The form can be obtained from the front office as well as from our school website. A certificate is issued by the school stating that the leave is approved by the principal and provides a reason for your child's absence from school should you be approached by police or other agencies.

> Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

# What are my Legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

We are currently reviewing the processes in place when dealing with student absences. We wish to work productively with families to ensure student success through regular attendance at school. Teachers, Assistant Principals, Deputy Principals and the Principal are all here to work with you to ensure satisfactory attendance for your child setting them up for the best chance to achieve success. I want to thank all of our families for working with us to ensure success for your child.

# HADLEY HELPERS TRAINING PROGRAM

This Term all Year 5 students and their teachers are being trained in the Hadley Helpers program. Hadley Helpers is a Peer Support Program which means it's students helping others by supporting them in play and making friends. It's about showing responsibility, leadership, problem solving and care for others.

We have already had one session in the first week of this term and the last two sessions are Thursday 19 May and Thursday 26 May.

When the training is complete, students will self-nominate themselves if they wish to be a Hadley Helper leader. The Hadley Helper leaders spend a lunchtime in either the Kindergarten Year 1 or 2 playgrounds just once a week supporting the students with positive play. The Hadley Helpers will wear a blue vest so that the students know they can go to them if they need help.

The Hadley Helper Leaders will have the opportunity to give feedback to a teacher weekly to ensure the program is working well for all.
